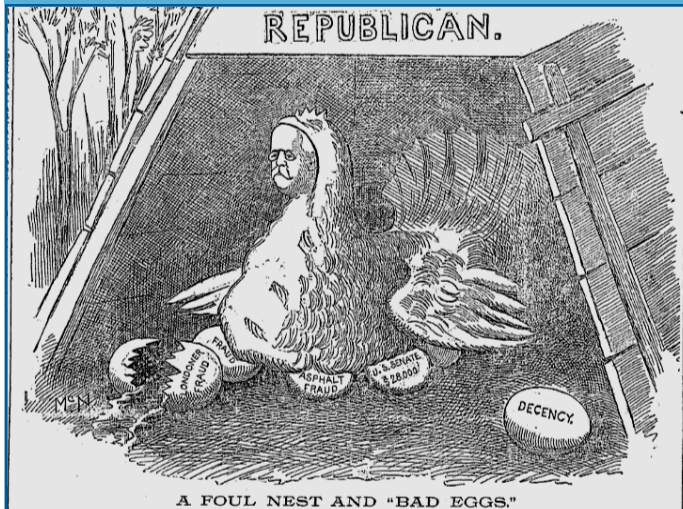
The following is a complete list of the casualties among the officers yesterday at Gettysburg:—

Brigadier General Francis Barlow, commanding First division, wounded and a prisoner.
Brigadier General Alexander Schemmelfennig, commanding Third division, taken prisoner; probably wounded.
Captain Stoedt, Adjutant General.
Colonel Wladimir Kryzhanowski, missing.
Lieutenant Burneghausen, Aid to Colonel Kryzhanowski, wounded.

Major George F. Kampe, missing.
Surgeon Carl W. Hazen, missing.


