THE BIRTH OF GAY POWER

On July 2, 1969, a new chapter was written in the history of the homophile movement. Outraged at politically-inspired raids on the Stonewall Inn and other gay bars, 400 maile and female homosexuals rioted in the streets of Greenwich Village.


A homosexual riot? The police were astounded, the gay community was astounded. Homosexuals have traditionalls been passive in the face of per-

members of other groups, gathered in a small park in Kew Gardens - the site of another instance of harrassment, the park where vigilantes hadchased homosexuals with flashlights and had cut down trees in order to deny then a place to meet. Speeches were made to the homosexuals and to the local residents who had gathered around, and a play was put on, the first play written and performed by homosexuals to satirize the heterosexual community. (We need more plays like this -- more art which describes the realities of homosexual life and the realities of heterosexual enough of their distortions.)

302.0 Sexual orientation disturbance [Homosexuality]

This category is for individuals whose sexual interests are directed primarily toward people of the same sex and who are either disturbed by, in conflict with, or wish to change their sexual orientation. This diagnostic category is distinguished from homosexuality, which by itself does not necessarily constitute a psychiatric disorder. Homosexuality per se is one form of sexual behavior and, like other forms of sexual behavior which are not by themselves psychiatric disorders, is not listed in this nomenclature of mental disorders.

AFFIRMATION


