School Librarians, K-12 Instructional/Technology Coaches, or anyone that supports teachers with using and implementing *Gale In Context* resources.

## What are the benefits to using this Toolkit?

**Save Time**: Librarians or coaches can quickly grab support material targeting specific curriculum topic areas. This also will save time for teachers because the messages incorporate some pre-built activities, lesson plans, tip sheets, etc.

On page 1 of this letter, you can enter your access point (where teachers will access the resources), plus add any special instructions on how to access. There is even a spot for a QR code, which you can create using your access point. Don't forget to add your contact info in case there are any questions about the resources. Once you've filled out page 1, save the document. You can then attach the newsletter to your email. Note that each of the messages in this Toolkit suggests using this welcome letter. If you choose not to use it, then modify the message so you do not reference the letter.
