Step 1: On the home page, locate the Basic Search Bar at the top of the page on the left.

Step 2: Type in what you would like to search. When searching for an answer you never want to put the entire question in the basic search bar. Pick one or two words from the question instead to get better results. For this question, a good search would be "Abraham Lincoln" since we are looking for information about his life.

Step 3: Once you have gotten to the results page for Abraham Lincoln, you will see the "Biography" content type and can click on any of those results to find the year he was born.

How many stages are in the life cycle of butterflies?

If you are ever unsure what terms to search in the **Basic Search Bar**, you can also use the **Topic Tree** browsing to find this answer.

Step 1: On the home page, scroll down to view the available **Topics**. Select the one your question is related to. For this question, butterflies would be related to animals so you would select the "**Animals**" Topic Tree.

Step 2: Now choose the next more specific topic related to butterflies. Since butterflies are insects, you would select "Insects and Other Invertebrates."

Step 3: From here, you will see all the **Topic Pages** related to "**Insects and Other Invertebrates"** and can select the "**Butterflies**" Topic Page to find the answer.
