TikTok Ban C.E.R.

Should the United States Government Ban the use of the TikTok App?

Grade Level: 9-12

Subject/Content: Social Studies/ELA

Summary of Lesson: Students will use *Gale In Context: Opposing Viewpoints* to analyze the proposed ban on TikTok by reading two opposing articles and staying caught up on current news content.

Resource: Gale In Context: Opposing Viewpoints

Time Frame: 45 minutes- 1 hour

Learning Expectation: Students will use their close reading skills to analyze two different views on a

current event in U.S. Politics.

Materials Needed:

Computer with internet access

- Copies of handouts provided
- Subscription to Gale In Context: Opposing Viewpoints

Procedures:

Steps/Activities by the Teacher:

- Introduce the contextualization video to explain the current issue. Students can watch together or individually and then answer the introductory questions.
- Students should then read articles over the issue and complete the C.E.R. chart for each article.
- (Optional) Teachers can choose their own articles over the TikTok ban or use the ones linked in the activity
- To continue their research students should read current news articles on the issue of the TikTok ban.
- Students should then complete their own C.E.R. chart with their own opinion.
- Extended: Students should then write their own viewpoint essay over whether TikTok should be banned in the United States.

CLAIM-EVIDENCE-REASONING (CER) WRITING

CER writing is designed to help you organize your opinion, research, and paper structure to effectively get your point across.

Getting into the flow of CER writing can be difficult, so we will first identify the claim, evidence, and reasonings of an article from Gale In Context. Using the graphic organizer below, evaluate your article and isolate the different parts of the text.

LAIM

- A statement that answers a question, or the mainpoint.
- Example: People are happier in wealthy countries.

YOUR ARTICLE'S CLAIM:

EVIDENCE

- Information to support the claim.
- Example: Surveys taken in multiple countries show that people in wealthy countries rate their happiness as higher.

YOUR ARTICLE'S EVIDENCE (MOST LIKELY MORE THAN ONE PIECE OF INFORMATION):

REASONING

- Explains how the evidence supports the claim.
- Example: Since the people surveyed in wealthy countries consistently rated themselves higher in happiness than poorer countries, the wealth of a country is a factor.
